Free for anyone in the world, available in left-hand menu: Cold Feet II (written info for waltz & two-step basics).

<u>Free</u> for ICBDA members (modest dues), available from *member homepage* right-hand menu (Find "How to Dance – Beginning Dance Manuals": 6 books (more detail for waltz and two-step, plus phase 3 patterns and some advanced variations for foxtrot, quickstep, Argentine tango, rumba, cha cha, mambo, and jive/swing. Plus a cross-referenced index to help find information quickly. These books include footprints.

Links to **where** in the world to dance (always cued in English), where to find beginning lessons, what dances are popular. Quarterly Newsletter with useful **information** including current dances being taught, list of up-coming festivals, etc.

Roundalab.org (Round dance teachers' association)

Roundalab standardizes cues and phase levels of figures (which can change) on behalf of the movement.

Index of Rounds - Cuesheets (tens of thousands of routines have been written, providing written instructions for interesting choreography!) Guidelines of how to write (and therefore how to read) cue sheets are available to anyone. The Index (linking to downloadable cuesheets) is searchable; data includes date of release, name of dance, choreographer/s, rhythm, level, music, etc. Download a cuesheet for a dance routine you wish to learn.

Subscription service for *videos* of figures and for *manual* of figure descriptions (no foot patterns) available to purchase.
