What Else Do I Need to Know About This Job?

- The selectee may be eligible to telework once he/she has demonstrated the ability to perform the duties of this position independently without close supervision or extensive input from other employees as determined by the supervisor.
- Daily and overnight travel is required. Overnight travel is approximately 50% of work time.
- Regular and recurring overtime work may be required. You must be available for such assignments.
