History: The Ukleja Center for Ethical Leadership was created in 2005 as a university center housed in the College of Business Administration at California State University, Long Beach. With a goal of providing positive solutions to ethical challenges facing our society, the center has a three-pronged approach to applied ethics. It focuses on university research, education, and community outreach through discovery, development, and dissemination of knowledge.

Initiatives: Education initiatives include a Student Leadership Institute, Ethics at The Beach, and Ethics Across the Curriculum. Community outreach efforts include the John Wooden Ethics in Leadership Award, Leading the Ethical Organization seminar, and William Dickson Faculty Fellows program, which has a Leader-in-Residence component. University research has resulted in the publication of a series of articles in the *Long Beach Business Journal*, faculty roundtables, and interdisciplinary ethics research.

Partnerships: The center is named for its founding donors, Louise and Mick Ukleja, long-time supporters of the CSULB campus and its programs. Other significant donors support the center's programs, including Los Angeles County Supervisor Don Knabe, Astro Aluminum Treating Company, Norris Foundation, Bess J. Hodges Foundation, Verizon Foundation, and Lindora, Inc. Organizations and individuals committed to promoting ethical leadership are welcome to participate as funding partners.
