

CRIMINAL JUSTICE MINOR REQUIREMENTS

22 Total Units Required

19 Units of Criminal Justice Core Courses (Note: Courses should be completed in the numbered sequence presented)

- ❑ **CRJU 101:** The Criminal Justice System in Society (3)
- ❑ **CRJU 110:** Justice Research, Writing, and Reasoning (3)
- ❑ **CRJU 301:** Criminal Courts and Judicial Processes (3)
- ❑ **CRJU 302:** Policing (3)
- ❑ **CRJU 303:** Corrections: Theory, Policy, and Practice (3)
- ❑ **CRJU 304:** Criminological Theory (4)

3 Units from the Following Criminal Justice Law Courses (select one)

- ❑ **CRJU 340:** Substantive Criminal Law (3) (Note: CRIM 151 does not substitute for this class)
- ❑ **CRJU 350:** Constitutional Criminal Procedure (3)

Additional Information about Minor Requirements:

- A grade of C or higher is required in all courses taken to fulfill the requirements of the minor.
- 30 units are required to enroll in 300-level courses.
- CRJU 101 (Introduction to Criminal Justice) is a prerequisite to all 300-level and 400-level CJ courses.
- CRJU 110 (Justice Research and Writing) is a prerequisite to all 300-level and 400-level CJ courses
- CRJU 110 (Justice Research and Writing) must be taken after completion of ENGL 100.
- CRJU 301 (Courts) is a prerequisite to CRJU 340 (Criminal Procedure) and 350 (Criminal Law).
- Lower-division courses will not be substituted for upper-division courses.
- Upper-division criminal justices courses from another four-year university may be substituted for a maximum of six (6) units of CRJU minor requirements with the approval of the department chair.
