Involving Incarcerated Fathers to Enhance Their Children's Quality of Education and Developmental Outcomes

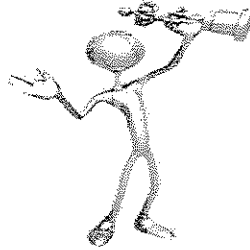

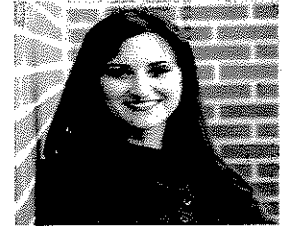

Her co-authors included Dr. Jacqueline Lee, RD and Dr. Wendy Reiboldt. This research was supported by a grant from Mead-Johnson that Emily received and an award received by Dr. Lee from the National Center on Minority Health and Health Disparities, and the National Institutes of Health.

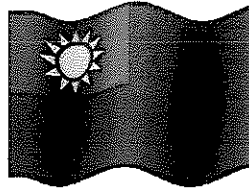
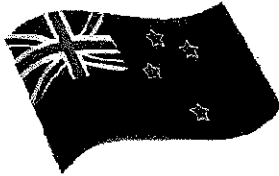

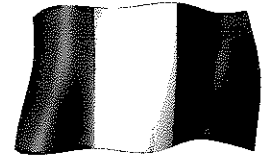

CSULB Received a USDA Grant

Transdisciplinary Graduate Education and Training to Prevent Latino Childhood Obesity

California State University of Long Beach received \$5 million USDA Grant to conduct research on Latino Childhood Obesity Prevention. This 5-year long project will involve highly qualified specialists participating in various areas of this research.

Britt Rios-Ellis, Ph.D., will serve as Co-Principal Investigator for the proposed project. As the Latino health and nutrition specialist, Dr. Rios-Ellis will allocate her time for project direction, course and materials development, faculty and student trainings, and supervision of project staff. Dr. Rios-Ellis will work directly with the USDA staff, and will work closely with two FCS department faculty member— Co-Pi Dr. Gail Frank and Co-Investigator Dr. Avery Goldstein.

As the nutrition science specialist, Dr. Gail Frank will allocate her time for project direction, course and materials development, and faculty and student trainings.

She will also have primary responsibility for recruiting RD or nutrition students as fellows. As the child development specialist, Dr. Avery Goldstein will allocate her time for course materials development, and faculty and student trainings.

Dr. Gail Frank and Dr. Avery Goldstein will also participate in the writing of required program progress reports and abstracts and will attend all required grantee meetings by the USDA.
