Use this checklist with the most recent *CSULB Catalog* to make your course selections. In addition to the Bachelor of Arts in Economics, the Economics Department also offers a Bachelor of Arts in Business Economics, a Bachelor of Arts in Economics with an Option in Mathematical Economics and Economic Theory, and minors in Economics, Business Economics, and International Economics. To graduate from CSULB with a major in economics you must complete a minimum of 120 units, of which at least 40 units are upper-division requirements, 51 units are G.E., and the remaining units are electives or minor requirements. You must also maintain a 2.0 (C) Grade Point Average in all of the following:

- (1) Your entire college record;
- (2) All units attempted at CSULB;
- (3) All courses in the major;
- (4) All courses in the major completed at CSULB; and
- (5) All upper division courses in the major completed at CSULB.

All courses leading to the major in economics must be taken for a letter grade. Use this checklist to keep track of your progress towards your economics degree.
