¹ Courses taken to complete your major may be double-counted in your minor (and for general education) if they are not offered by your major department. For example, ECON 101 is a required course for many majors including business administration, international studies, health care administration, engineering, home economics and many others. Students majoring in one of these subjects can triple-count ECON 101 as a requirement for their major, a requirement for the economics minor, and for general education.

² Students with upper division status declaring the minor may substitute ECON 300 for ECON 100 and 101.
