- ① ALL LOWER- AND UPPER-DIVISION GE REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL EDUCATION--Because the General Education program is designed to provide breadth, no more than 10 units of Journalism may be used to satisfy GE requirements for Journalism majors, and the courses (currently JOUR 110, 315 and 312I) must be approved for GE when the course is taken. JOUR 312I is an approved Capstone course.
