WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any student whose career objective is broadcast journalism and who currently is studying at sophomore level or above at an accredited Southern California college or university.

WHAT ARE THE RTNA / JIM ZAILLIAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP, AND THE HAL FISHMAN MEMORIAL AWARDS?

The Radio and Television News Association of Southern California (RTNA) is the Southland's leading organization for broadcast journalists. One scholarship is named in honor of the late Jim Zaillian, who served as KNX news director for ten years. Zaillian was an active member of RTNA and had a special interest in the education of broadcast journalism students. Another scholarship is named in honor of Hal Fishman, legendary anchor at KTLA. Winners will receive their scholarship awards at the **Golden Mike Awards Banquet** on January 23, 2010.

WHERE CAN I APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP?

Students may apply online by visiting our website, www.rtna.org, and filling out the online application.

WHEN IS THE DEADLINE?

All applications must be received no later than October 31, 2009. Applications submitted after that date will not be eligible. Supporting material such as proof of enrollment, letters of recommendation, etc. should be received by mail no later than November 30, 2009.
