

# MATHEMATICS DIAGNOSTIC PLACEMENT TEST

## REGISTRATION INFORMATION

**Please read the following information before registering for the test.**

### Who needs to take the test?

The Mathematics Diagnostic Placement Test (MDPT) is mandatory for freshmen who want to take one of the following classes and have **not** taken the prerequisite.

- Math 119A: Survey of Calculus I
- Math 122: Calculus I

### THE FOLLOWING STUDENTS ARE EXEMPT:

Freshmen who are enrolled in, and are passing the prerequisite to the mathematics course they intend to enroll in. This only applies to the courses listed above. Freshmen that have taken the AP Calculus Exam and scored 3 or better.

If you are unsure which mathematics course you need to take, please check the CSULB Catalog and/or the department of your prospective major.

The MDPT Calculus Readiness exam is a multiple choice test that consists of 2 components; trigonometry and algebra. To fully evaluate your mathematical skills, the use of a **calculator is not allowed**. To get an idea of the type of question you can expect, please check the section with sample questions. Be aware that you will be taking the Calculus Readiness exam, not the Mathematical Analysis exam.

### When is the test offered?

The MDPT will be offered on:

- Friday June 12, 2009
- Friday June 19, 2009
- Friday July 10, 2009
- Friday August 14, 2009
- Friday June 26, 2009 (OPEN TO SCIENCE SAFARI STUDENTS ONLY!)

On the day of the test, please bring the following:

- Valid Photo ID with the name you used to register for the test.
- No. 2 Pencil

**Students who are late and those without a valid form of photo identification might not be admitted!**

## How much is the registration fee?

There is no registration fee for the MDPT.

## How do I register?

## Test Location and Time

On Friday June 12, June 19, July 10 and August 14, the test will be held in FO3 room 200A.

The FO3 building is located near the University Bookstore.

The test starts at 9:00AM and ends around 12:00PM. Please arrive 10 minutes early.

Late arrivals might not be admitted.

The test takes up to 90 minutes to administer and you might not be allowed to leave the room early, even when you are done with the test. You are not allowed to use your cell phone, Blackberry, I-Pod or any other device while you wait.

## How do I get my test results?

If you have taken the test at least 3 days before your SOAR meeting your results will be available at your SOAR meeting. Results will not be distributed thru mail or over the phone. You can also receive your test score by visiting the Math Department Office located in building FO3 room 120 starting 3 days after your test date.
