

## Strategies for Academic Success Academic Probation Intervention Program What is the Next Step?

You are placed on academic probation if either your overall cumulative (all college work) and/or your CSULB cumulative grade point average (GPA) falls below a 2.0 (or C grade point average). University policy states that if you remain on academic probation for two consecutively enrolled semesters, you will be subject to disqualification from CSULB. If, however, while you are on academic probation, you complete both Steps 1 and 2 below, you may receive a third semester in which to bring your overall CSULB cumulative and/or overall cumulative college GPA back up to a 2.0, provided that you make satisfactory academic progress.

**Step 1** - Attend this workshop. You have received information about academic probation rules and regulations and spent time identifying areas where you may need some assistance in improving your academic standing. Students who do follow up by seeking and receiving assistance in these areas generally do improve their grade point averages.

**Step 2** - Complete a Follow-up appointment with at least ONE (1) additional campus office or service this semester.

### TO COMPLETE STEP 2, TAKE THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- 1) Look at the questionnaire you completed at the workshop. What areas did you check on the sheet? This list will give you ideas of which office(s) you should contact for a follow-up appointment. Use the list of offices found at the bottom of this sheet.
- 2) When you decide where to do a follow-up appointment, make an appointment with that office. All campus services see students by appointment, either one-on-one or in a group setting. Please complete the follow-up appointment form thoroughly, sign it and take it with you to your appointment. Ask a staff member to sign and stamp the form to indicate that you have received assistance.
- 3) After you visit at least ONE (1) office, return the follow-up appointment form to the Academic Advising Center in the Horn Center, Room 103 by the deadline. **There will be NO EXCEPTIONS to the deadline.**

**Do not wait until the deadline to complete this step because the time required to participate in an intervention program varies.** All campus services see students by appointment, either one-on-one or in a group setting. Plan ahead and make your appointment immediately so that you have time to complete the second step.
