

Strategies for Academic Success Academic Probation Intervention Program What is the Next Step?

You are placed on academic probation if either your overall cumulative (all college work) and/or your CSULB cumulative grade point average (GPA) falls below a 2.0 (or C grade point average). Students are subject to academic disqualification at the end of their first semester on academic probation if they have CSULB or overall GPAs below the four minimum GPA listed as follows:

Freshmen (fewer than 30 units completed) with a CSULB or overall GPA below 1.5

Sophomores (30-59 units completed) with a CSULB or overall GPA below 1.7

Juniors (60-89 units completed) with a CSULB or overall GPA below 1.85

Seniors (90 plus units completed) with a CSULB or overall GPA below 1.95

Students whose CSULB and overall GPAs are higher than the four listed above can remain on academic probation for two consecutive semesters before academic disqualification takes place

If, however, while you are on academic probation, you complete both Steps 1 and 2 listed below, you may appeal to have your academic probation extended for one additional semester, provided that you make satisfactory academic progress.

Step 1 - Attend this workshop. You have received information about academic probation rules and regulations and spent time identifying areas where you may need some assistance to improve your academic standing. Students who do follow up and seeking and receiving assistance in these areas generally do improve their grade point averages.

Step 2 - Complete a follow-up appointment with a minimum of ONE (1) campus office or service, additional assistance recommended. The follow-up form must be returned to the Academic Advising Center by the deadline specified at the workshop.

- Juniors and Seniors MUST receive assistance from their Major Department Advisor.

TO COMPLETE STEP 2, TAKE THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- 1) Look at the questionnaire you completed at the workshop. What areas did you check on the sheet? This list will give you ideas of which office(s) you should contact for a follow-up appointment. Use the list of offices found at the bottom of this sheet.
- 2) When you decide where to do a follow-up appointment, make an appointment with that office. All campus services see students by appointment, either one-on-one or in a group setting. Please complete the follow-up appointment form thoroughly, sign it and take it with you to your appointment. Ask a staff member to sign and stamp the form to indicate that you have received assistance.
- 3) After you visit at least ONE (1) office, return the follow-up appointment form to the Academic Advising Center in the Horn Center, Room 103 by the deadline. **There will be NO EXCEPTIONS to the deadline.**

Do not wait until the deadline to complete this step because the time required to participate in an intervention program varies. Plan ahead and make your appointment immediately so that you have time to complete the second step.
