Wollongong, New South Wales

With a population of 300,000 Wollongong is large enough to offer all the entertainment facilities and conveniences of a big city, yet small enough to retain the friendly, relaxed atmosphere of a coastal community.

UOW main campus is located at the foothills of Mount Keira and less than five kilometers from the Pacific Ocean and the city centre. Established in 1951 the university is home to 18,000 students spread across three campuses and nine faculties. International students come from over 70 countries and make up approximately 30 per cent of the student population. UOW offers a diverse range of specialized programs and has received top rankings from the Australian Good Universities Guide.
