6 (1) Support for the concept of the program to be administered by RheinlandPfalz  
7 Land in Germany, STEP, Inc., and Georgetown University, making higher  
8 education enrollment in American universities available to German students;  
9  
10 (2) Approval of action already taken by Dr. Wilm Pelters and Dr. Alan Johnson to  
11 involve CSULB in the pilot program to be inaugurated in Fall, 1975;  
12  
13 (3) Acceptance of the policy statement submitted by the Foreign Admissions sub-  
14 committee (of International Programs) regarding foreign student visa options,  
15 presented by Dr. George LaDue. The Policy Statement reads as follows:  
16

17 Within the framework of Trustee approved policy guidelines for Foreign Student  
18 Programs, the University wishes to attract high quality students from abroad and provide  
19 for them an educational program serving both their competencies and interests and the  
20 needs of the countries from which they come. In issuing Certificates of Eligibility for  
21 securing views from abroad or for approval of transfer from another U. S. academic  
22 institution, the University follows U. S. Government policies, with special attention to  
23 other countries' needs, as follows:

- 25 (a) To students from the less developed countries, those which have indicated  
26 to the U.S. State Department that they have critical shortages of manpower  
27 in certain disciplines as indicated by enumerations in the Country Skills  
28 List, only the Certificate of Eligibility for the Exchange Visitor-Student (J-  
29 I) visa (Form DSP-66) will be issued.  
30  
31 (b) Students receiving financial aid from any government source will be  
32 issued Form DSP-66.  
33 (c) Other non-immigrant students will be routinely issued the same kind of  
34 Certificate of Eligibility (Form DSP-66), but they will be offered as an  
35 elective option the Certificate for Student Visa- (F-I) status, Form I-20,  
36 together with an explanation of the requirements and characteristics of  
37 each.
