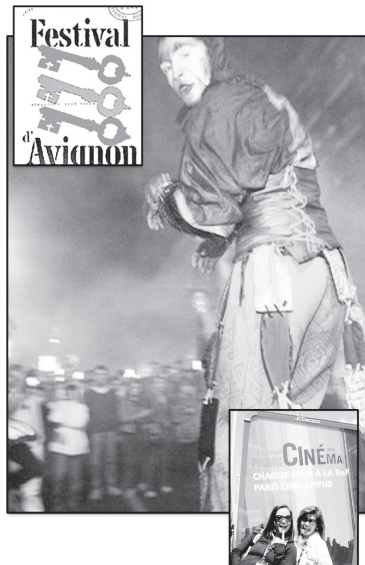

Theatre and Cinema THEA 425I Paris and Avignon

Open to all majors (no background necessary)
GE capstone (▲), category C1 or C3

- The course will examine relationships between French theater and film from the birth of cinema at the end of the 19th century through today.
- Films and plays will be viewed in Paris and Avignon and explored historically and within the artistic movements of realism, melodrama, and comedy.
- Students will develop a critical understanding of French theater and cinema as cultural forms with an analysis of gender, ethnic and racial constructions using concepts from contemporary critical theory and cultural studies.
