(Open to all majors)

- Comparative study of the global community in antiquity, focus on Asia and its intersections with Rome through site visits in Rome;
- Comparison of ancient life in Asian urban centers (Loyang, Mohenjo Daro, Angkor Wat) and Rome;
- Comparison of gender roles, class/caste in Asia and Rome;
- Comparison of religious beliefs and art aesthetics (the body);
- Comparison of religio-mythic basis of kings and emperors in Asia and Rome;
- Comparison of philosophical foundations of Asian culture;

- PLUS excursions in and around Rome with discussions jointly with the course: Pagan Culture including participation in a gladiatorial school!
