Unfortunately your letter was mis-directed---Dr. John Dackawich of the Sociology Department and Dr. Nathan Huggins of the History Department have been the faculty advisors for Pi Gamma Mu this year.

The Office of Student Affairs was notified and the information should be in their files, and I believe they have previously been in contact with Dr. Huggins.

Your letter, dated January 8, was not received by me until after your meeting of Friday, January 10, was held. Otherwise, I am sure that the present faculty advisors or one of the other Pi Gamma Mu representatives would have been most happy to attend as you requested.

I regret there has been some confusion in this matter. I believe Pi Gamma Mu is an important and worthwhile organization. I am passing your letter on to Dr. Dackawich and Dr. Huggins, and I hope that it will be possible for you to reinstate Pi Gamma Mu as early as possible when the question of documents has been resolved.

Dr. Dixon reported that he was no longer the faculty advisor to Pi Gamma Mu and reported that you now hold that position.

The Judiciary will again meet to discuss the case of Pi Gamma Mu and therefore we ask that some representative of the organization be present.

The meeting will be held Tuesday, Feb. 18th, at 1:00 p.m. in the A. S. Senate chambers.


