SUMMARY REPORT

Case of: Lipton vs Associated Students
Elections Commission

Date : April 7, 1965

Charges: Voting irregularities listed in complaint

Opinion: It is the opinion of this court that the violations as pre-

sented are true and can be divided into three basic areas:
~~Decision:~~ lack of regulations, sloppiness of poll workers, and inability
to classify students according to divisions.

Since it is not the place of this court to legislate, we can only recommend that these irregularities be rectified.

We urge the proper legislative authority to enact stricter responsibilities for the Elections Commission to insure that violations such as those presented are impossible to occur in the future.

We urge the Elections Commission to educate the poll workers so that they realize their responsibility to the Student Body.

We urge the proper authorities to research the feasibility of continuing the present divisional constituency if accurate lists of students cannot be provided of these constituencies.

Decision: IT IS THE DECISION OF THIS COURT that though the violations are true, they are violations of no code of laws, but rather of custom and tradition, and are of little consequence to the final outcome of this election. We therefore declare

ORDER OF THE COURT


To: *Elections Commission*
