

OFFICIAL COURT DECISION

CASE: ASSOCIATED STUDENT BODY, LBSC, VS. SINAWIK

- Charges: 1. Placing unauthorized posters and literature on other campuses without their approval.  
2. Lack of adequate supervision at the dance in question

The evidence adduced in the first charge was said posters returned from the respective campuses. To this complaint the defendants answer accepting full responsibility for the distribution.

The evidence adduced to the other was a complaint filed by the Chairman of the Student Conduct Committee. To this charge the Advisor to the SINAWIK Club accepted the responsibility for the lack of supervision and for the allowance of non-student members into the dance. She and her husband were to be there prior to the start of the dance and were each and both late, thereby causing large groups to congregate in front of the College Dining Hall. The lighting of the campus area was also accepted and the same situation as to the Handbook for Social Chairmen arose. But in light of the first case, in re Los Alamitos Hall, the Activities Advisor, Dikran Martin should have indicated that an occurrence had happened at the Bel Air Affair, and should have taken measures to insure that reoccurrence would not take place. In this case the Police in attendance were asked by the Advisory to SINAWIK if they were patrolling the outside, forthwith one policeman made a cursory tour of the parking lot in back of the Cafeteria, this was the last such trip.

THEREFORE, this Court recommends that a letter of apology be forthcoming from SINAWIK to the injured schools.

Further, that the Dean of Students cause the recommendations in the decision prior, in Los Alamitos Hall, to be fulfilled.

Further, that a reprimand be sent from the Dean of Students Office to the SINAWIK Club, and a copy forwarded to the Advisor to said group, and to the injured schools.
