SUMMARY REPORT

Case of: Karla Roberts & Shelby Wilson vs The A. S. Elections Commission

Date : April 26, 1967

Charges: That the Elections Commission violated Chapter 2, Article VI, Section 2 C

Decision: The A. S. Judiciary rules that the Plaintiffs, Shelby Wilson and Karla Roberts shall be seated to their duly elected seats in the A. S. Senate. We further rule that a fine of \$10. per candidate be imposed upon them to be paid by Friday, May 5, 1967 to the Associated Students. Failure to make payment will result in their disqualification.

We recommend that the Election Commission amend by inserting in Chapter 1 Section 4 "Qualifications for Office" a reasonable deposit fee for clean-up of campaign materials. Also the Commission is recommended to re-examine their rules pertaining to formal protest and grounds for disqualification and amend so as to properly set criteria for these acts. The Court in particular, is concerned with rules that violate Chapter 2 Sections 4 and 5 since the disqualification of candidates on grounds of violations, which are not effective until the election is concluded are of a unique nature. Finally, since the Elections Commission should have the power to make disqualifications within a reasonable time after the election, we feel that Chapter IX should be restructured.
