DECLARATORY JUDGEMENT

TO: ELECTIONS COMMISSION

FROM: ASSOCIATED STUDENTS JUDICIARY

In Re: CONSTITUENCY OF EDUCATION SCHOOL

The Associated Students Judiciary does hereby find that the Constituency of the School of Education, by virtue of the A. S. Bylaws Chapter I, Article V, Section 2b which reads in part.....Two (2) Senators from each of the six academic schools, with the exceptions of the School of Education with one senator.....is to be interpreted as meaning that the Senator does in effect represent the school and not any particular person (s) who may be participating in a class offered by that school.

A school consists of those persons who are majoring in one of the fields of the school, as per Bylaws Chapter I, Article I, Sec. 2B and Chapter I, Article V, Sec. 2b (School senators shall be selected from those majoring in one of the various departments of the particular school.).

Therefore, we conclude that only persons who have received their Baccalaureate degree and are studying for the Master's Degree in Education or majoring in that field.
