
The undersigned requests a review of the rights and duties pursuant to:

Election Code Chapter V, Sec 3, paragraph B&C.

Cause for request: On the application for A.S. office, I clearly stated that the title I wanted printed on the ballot to be "Member College Union Operating Board". The Elections Commission has arbitrarily changed that title to "Assoc. Justice" also numerous changes have been occurring on the sample ballot, since its deadline last Friday 9/22.

Briefly explain the substance of your issue: I believe that as a candidate for office in the present election, that I am being put at a distinct disadvantage through the forementioned actions of the Elections Commission - I request that the ballot be changed to follow the guidelines established by the Elections Code

DECLARATORY JUDGEMENT

Plaintiff: Bill Latham

Plaintiff, Bill Latham, candidate for the office of Associated Students Representative to the College Union cites the Elections Code, California State College Long Beach, Chapter V, Section 3, subsection B., which states:

"Candidates may have the title of any position which they are currently holding, listed after their names on the ballot."

Plaintiff alleges that instead of the requested title, "Member, College Union Operating Board," his title, upon the ballot for the run-off election scheduled for the 28th through 30th of April, reads, "Associate Justice."

The Court has found that the Plaintiff is erroneous in his allegation, and that the title after his name upon the ballot reads, "Member, College Union Operating Board."
