SENATE REVIEW OF NON-FINANCIAL BOARD OF CONTROL ACTIONS

Cause for request: CHAPTER I Article IV SEC 6 of the Bylaws states that Financial measures and expenditures adopted by the BOC shall be submitted to the Senate. Chapter II Article I SEC 2A2 says all "actions" of the BOC be approved by the Senate.

Briefly explain the substance of your issue: Can the wording of Chapter II Article I Sec 2A2 be interpreted to include non-financial actions of the B.O.C. This appears to be the intention of the language used. I do not feel this conflicts with the language of Chapter I Article IV Sec 6.

The Associated Student's Judiciary declines to take the "Request for Declaratory Judgment" by Jim Vail which asked for a clarification of A.S. Senate powers of review over non-financial actions of the Board of Control.

The A.S. Judiciary justifies its rejection on the basis that the issue of "Senate review of non-financial actions of the Board of Control" has been resolved by a recent decision of the Judiciary in a Declaratory Judgment requested by Jim Vail concerning the Board of Control's power to allocate A.S. office space without approval of the A.S. Senate. Mr. Vail is therefore directed to review the Court's decision in the afore-mentioned case and will hopefully find his question satisfactorily answered therein.
