6. Public Comments

Ms. Tzin Cooper spoke on behalf of the African Students Association. She wished to inform the Board about changes made to the ASU activities calendar for the month. She stated their fundraiser has moved to Oct 17th from 11-3pm at the South West Terrace. She also stated their High School Outreach program has been rescheduled to Nov 5th and added it is being planned on a larger scale and that they are working along with SLD.

Mr. Chance Decker and Ms. Gabby Falcone wished to remind the Senate of a few upcoming events. They passed out flyers detailing the Men's and Women's Basketball practice schedule and asked everyone to come out and support them. They also talked about the upcoming Women's Volleyball game and the Spirit competition.

Mr. Karan Parikh spoke to the Board about the upcoming Rass and Garba night being organized by the Indian Student Association in the USU Ballroom on Oct 22nd. He gave the Board flyers concerning the event and invited everyone to attend.

Mr. William Harris, the captain of the Men's crew team and coach of the Ultimate Frisbee team expressed concerns he had over the recent Rec-Center survey. He stated the survey did not discuss the issue of ground facilities. He said the ground facilities on campus at present are inadequate to meet the needs of all the different organizations that are using it and something has to be done to accommodate all of them. He also added that the grounds currently lacks floodlights and enquired about who should be contacted to address these concerns. He also announced that the crew team was having its opening race of the season in Sacramento on Oct 29th.

Ms. Olmedo stated she was still waiting for a reply from the Parking and Transportation concerning the Beach cruisers. She also reported students have approached her with suggestions that the USU stay open longer hours. She also stated she has been receiving a lot of complaints about limited wireless access in the Library on certain floors.

10. Special Order Session

C. Report from the Executive Director of the Associated Students

Mr. Haller gave the Senate an update on Legislative issues. He gave details concerning the bills the Governor has vetoed and how it affects Cal State. He also elaborated on bills the governor approved and signed.

On the funding front, he stated that a grant of \$39,460 has been obtained from the California Department of Conservation for the Recycling Center. He added that the CDC received \$2500 from the Los Angeles Transportation Club. This is in addition to the \$3000 Target has donated to the Child Development Center. He stated that a grant from the federal Department of Education has been renewed in the amount of \$125,000 per year. On policies, he stated the Stipend and Fellowship Policies are being presented today. He gave details concerning the policy and added he would be available to any member of the Board to discuss the issue further. He also elaborated on the other policies the BOC is currently working on.

A. Report from the President of the Associated Students

Cabinet Update:

Michael Barker, Assistant Secretary for City Affairs, has been planning to have local high school students visit our school and shadow our student government leaders. She stated most of the details for next Wednesday have been finalized. She gave details concerning the program.

She stated Ms. Elena Delgado, Assistant Secretary for System wide Affairs, has been actively organizing a voter registration campaign for the November Special Election. She is working with Zahra Billoo to construct an incentive

program to reward students for voting. Mr. Godina and herself will be soliciting the 49er Shops for the Office of Governmental and Community Relations for donations.

Natalie Albert, Secretary for Communications, has been generating Press Releases as needed and e-mailing weekly events to all of student government.

The Union vendors have joined the Beach Pride Tuesday promotion. The promotional items are being finalized and will be ready to go by next Tuesday.

Several of the Executive officers attended the Academic Senate retreat last Friday. They took part in all discussions and give valuable input on behalf of the students. She added she is confident their presence at the retreat combined with the academic retention survey will allow the AS to work closer with academic affairs to serve our students.

Ms. Chavez gave the Board details concerning the Amendment and revisions made by Documents & Bylaws. Ms. Herrera stated that policies that involve money being distributed to people should be bought before the student body for election. Discussion ensued.

(M) Chavez (S) Km to make friendly amendment to strike section 3.B.2.3 (Pg 2) and add it to special officers (Pg 5)

The Board discussed the role of the Executive Officers, Presidential candidates and the duration of the hours they work.

Friendly amendment offered by Senator Chavez to strike paragraph B.3 and 4, and further add D.1 and 2 was accepted. Discussion ensued on other items of the Amendment.

Under the previous order, the Chair suspended the debate and proceeds into the special order session to receive Report from the Treasurer of the Associated Students.

- B. Report from the Treasurer of the Associated Students

Treasurer Tinoco distributed the financial report to the Senate. She gave details concerning it, she elaborated on the Key financial and key operating ratios. She gave details about the net assets, liabilities, revenue and expenses. She also gave her view on the Executive Fellowship and Stipend policies and discussed the claim schedule. She explained that the claims schedule comes to her first to be signed, however, both the President and Vice President are authorized to sign claim schedules with checks attached. This authority has been standard for several years and each new group of elected Executives sign a Memo of Understanding at the beginning of their term.

The Senate resumed debate on the motion to pass B. Amdt. #2006-01.

Friendly amendment offered by Senator McClinton to add paragraph B.2.a.6) was accepted. The Board discussed the changes made. Debate was done on whether the changes were needed or not. The Board discussed the Chief of Staff's report and whether it should be made weekly or not at all.

However, both she and Mr. Haller are in favor of adding new policies as new agenda items so the Board votes on policies as a separate issue.
