For students who need legal advice, but don't know where to turn, AS Judiciary is sponsoring Pro Bono Legal Advisement. The AS Judiciary has invited the Long Beach Bar Association to come to campus and provide free legal advice to students.

"We hope this service meets the needs of all students. From students well informed about the law to those who don't know where to begin," said ASI Chief Justice Pro Tem Regina Suh.

According to Assistant Director of Student Involvement and Leadership Kim Hinckson, attorneys will be available on campus once a month and students can meet with them after making an appointment through the AS Government Office. To make an appointment contact the office at 562.985.5241.

In hopes to inspire and motivate academic interest in law, AS Judiciary is starting the first CSULB Undergraduate Law Journal. Students from all majors can submit essays and research focusing on issues related to law and society.
