 - Malcolm: Implicit bias. Faculty prejudged even before students respond to the questions. Discussions in workshops about open ended questions.
 - Tian: SPOT has been a key item in the RTP process. Even if we introduce other items will still be used as a benchmark. Unless there is a change. It is also a voluntary survey. It is a student perception. It is not an assessment of how good of a teacher you are, it is a reflection of a student's perception of your teaching. There have been rejections for tenure over this. Call attention to how we interpret the averages and numbers needs to be addressed.
