We are excited to begin a new academic year at CSULB! The campus is taking strict safety precautions to manage the pandemic and we are starting the Fall semester in hybrid modality with our staff and faculty working and teaching both on campus and remotely. We are happy to welcome many students back on campus for face-to-face and hybrid classes, events, activities, and support services; with others taking classes online.

I am really amazed by the incredible ways in which everyone in the College rallied together last year in support of our students, our programs, and each other. As a College, we focused on addressing anti-Black racism, centering issues of equity in the work that we do, and supporting the College community to be successful in a virtual environment.

The College saw growth across all our programs with a 58% increase in applications to our graduate programs during the 2020-2021 academic year! We are proud to grant a record 1,103 teaching, administrative, counseling, psychologist, and other credentials and authorizations to our students last year. And we are certainly doing our part to address the teacher shortage in the state, with 821 well-prepared newly credentialed CSULB teachers entering an excellent job market!

We look forward to staying focused on our strategic priorities and University Beach 2030 goals in the coming academic year as we build our clinical practice and technology infrastructure, support research excellence, and continue working towards racial equity and developing equity-minded behaviors and practices.


