Action Steps



- Disseminate a newsletter each semester to faculty and staff on student success goals, ongoing initiatives, and resources for faculty and students.
- Work with Enrollment Services and Institutional Research to expand access on actionable data that could be shared with faculty (e.g. grade reports, incoming GPA of students).
- Conduct short student surveys following advising workshops to get more information on students' plans.

Impact

- Lay the foundation for a wider understanding of student success issues throughout the college.
- Lead to more awareness that could influence their interactions with students and how faculty approach their teaching.
- Use data collected on student plans and workloads so that we can better help and advise students.

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Goal #2

 Increase data fluency among department chairs and staff.

Action Steps

- Provide training to department chairs and staff.
- Mentor department chairs and staff.
- Provide an annual Student Success report on the state of each department.
- Create a department chair webpage.

Impact

- Empower department chairs and staff to use data more effectively in day-to-day duties.
- Allow for a more constructive dialogue amongst departments and faculty on student success issues.

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Goal #2

 Increase data fluency among department chairs and staff.

Action Steps

- Provide training to department chairs and staff on data sources most impactful for their respective areas.
- Mentor department chairs and staff on departmental issues impacting to student success (e.g. scheduling, grade reports, faculty evaluations).
- Provide an annual Student Success report on the state of each department.
- Create a department chair webpage
 with links to reports or information on
 reports that they need in their roles, as
 well as access the CBA Department Chair
 Guide.

Impact

- Empower department chairs and staff to use data more effectively in their day-to-day duties
- Allow for a a more constructive dialogue amongst departments and faculty as to ways to improve graduation rates and reduce attrition.

- Provide access and training.
- Establish a collaborative environment, and follow it up with actionable decisions.

- Use data for actionable decisions (e.g. policy changes, admission criteria, create/modify student success initiatives, curriculum changes).

- Provide access and training on data sources.
- Establish a collaborative environment for sharing research and analyses, which must be followed up with actionable decisions.

- Conduct research to identify reasons for low graduation rates and high attrition, and most effective ways to make improvements.
- Use data for actionable decisions (e.g. policy changes, admission criteria, create/modify student success initiatives, curriculum changes).

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TIMELINE FOR CHANGES

TIMELINE	GOAL	ACTION STEPS
Begin Summer 2017	#1	Work with Enrollment Services and Institutional Research to expand access on actionable data.
2017-2018	#2	Create a department chair webpage. Provide data training and mentorship to department chairs and staff.
2017-2018	#1	Presenting at department and advisor meetings, disseminating newsletter to faculty and staff, and conducting short student surveys.
2017-2018	#2	Provide annual student success report.
Begin Fall 2017	#3	Disseminate Center for Student Success (CSS) newsletters and track data.
Begin Fall 2017	#3	Mandatory Sophomore Workshop for second-year students.
Begin Spring 2018	#4	Search for representatives for the CBA Team for Student Success.
Begin Fall 2018	#4	Establish CBA Team for Student Success, set expectations, provide data access and training, and establish a collaborative environment. Follow up research and analyses with action.

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POTENTIAL CHALLENGES

- Expect challenges with segments of Goal #3 and Goal #4.
- Challenges include:
 - Creating a culture shift as we promote full academic workloads to help more students complete degrees in 4 years.
 - Encouraging students to engage in the college beyond the classroom and keeping momentum through graduation.
 - Finding faculty representatives who are not only interested in conducting research to improve student success, but that also have time to dedicate to this pursuit.
 - FERPA issues & accessing more data that may not currently be available (e.g. How much can faculty access; How can we better gather alumni data?)

EXPECTED SUCCESSES

- Expect successes in Goal #1, #2, and segments of #3.
- Through Data Fellows, have laid the foundation to begin bringing more information back to the college (aid with Goal #1).
- Have years of experience building rapport and working closely with department chairs and staff. This will help as we seek to provide more mentorships and trainings on data sources and student success efforts (aid with Goal #2).
- Have great advisors and staff in the Center for Student Success that can keep students informed, teach them how to utilize degree planner, and encourage them to engage beyond the classroom.
