SLO #5: Integrate technology into reading/language arts instruction.

Description of the Signature Assignment

This comprehensive assignment requires a great deal of thinking and planning from candidates in terms of using a WebQuest lesson format to address curricular standards.

Directions for Students

- Identify one curricular content you are going to teach.
- Identify California content standards and ISTE (International Society for Technology in Education) standards for the lesson. (*I suggest that you print out the ISTE standards I have posted under "Resources" "Standards" on the BeachBoard*).
- In planning your lesson, make sure that you build on your students' experiences with technology use and with various texts.
- Develop a WebQuest lesson, using the PowerPoint presentation tool. The length of the lesson can range from 30-45 minutes (depending on your teaching schedule and students' needs). The number of slides can range from 7-10. The slides include these WebQuest components: *Introduction, Task, Process, Evaluation, and Conclusion*. Follow the steps outlined in the WebQuest PowerPoint Presentation I have developed. Focus on the content FIRST. Make your slides interesting and colorful after you have completed all the WebQuest components.
- You then present the WebQuest lesson to your students who will complete the task(s) in the lesson.

The final product you will turn in to the instructor for your grade is a PowerPoint Presentation which includes the following components:

1. Your WebQuest Lesson (with the components of *Introduction, Task, Process, Evaluation, and Conclusion* PLUS Teacher Page and Credits)
2. Your Reflection (Please be specific in your response to each question.)
 - a. What type of students' experiences with technology use did you build into this WebQuest lesson?
 - b. What type of students' experiences with texts did you build into this WebQuest lesson?
 - c. What did your students learn from this WebQuest lesson?
 - d. What did you learn from developing and implementing this WebQuest lesson?
 - e. What might you change if you develop a similar WebQuest lesson? (Think about the format and content of the WebQuest lesson)
