79 80 81 82 83	1.4 Except as excluded by University policy, voting rights in this Faculty Council are extended to: a) tenured and tenure-track Library faculty at the time of a vote, and b) temporary Library faculty with at least a half-time appointment at the time of a vote. Voting rights are not extended to the Dean or the Associate Dean.
