

Fifth Annual Southern California Philosophy Conference

Call for Student Papers

Postmark deadline: July 1, 2000

The Fifth Annual Southern California Philosophy conference will be held on Saturday, October 21, 2000, on the campus of California State University, Long Beach.

We will continue the tradition of a session of student papers selected after formal blind review, modelled after the APA blind-review process. We appreciate your assistance in forwarding this invitation to your own students who might be interested in submitting a paper. Papers are invited on any area of philosophy by students currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate philosophy program in Southern California, who will not have their Ph.D. in hand prior to September 2000.

Eligible students should submit their papers in triplicate, double-spaced, 10-12 pages (about 20 minutes reading time). An abstract of no more than 100 words should also be submitted. No identification should be included on the paper or abstract. Identifying information, including school affiliation, student status (graduate/undergraduate, expected completion of degree), mailing address, telephone number, and e-mail address should be included on a separate page mailed with the paper. Student papers should be postmarked no later than July 1, 2000 and sent to:
