I. Course description: Introduction to financial accounting theory and practice.

II. <u>Text</u>: Financial Accounting: Tools for Business Decision Making (Kimmel, Weygandt, Kieso 5<sup>th</sup> ed.) ISBN-13: 978-0-470-23980-3.

<u>Alternate</u>: This course utilizes WileyPlus which provides a complete online text and multiple other learning tools for about 60% of the cost of the cost of the published text book. Full instructions to utilize this option are listed in section X. below. WileyPlus is required if you wish to avail yourself of the online homework option and is strongly encouraged.

- III. <u>Course objectives</u>: Prepare the student for a career in business administration through a thorough understanding of basic financial accounting theory.
- IV. <u>Description of Assignments</u>: Students are encouraged to <u>read the assigned material before class</u> and attempt to <u>complete the homework prior to class</u>. Homework is <u>due</u> the class meeting after the lecture.
  - Homework is a graded component of the course and is done online and graded online. No late homework will
    be accepted. The homework is intended to insure that students can apply the concepts explained in the
    lecture.
- V. <u>Classroom procedures and attendance policy</u>: The class is a lecture format utilizing classroom examples, internet material and student questions to illustrate the topics under discussion. Reading and homework material is reviewed during each class session.

- It is essential that the student understand that it is impossible to grasp these accounting skills without practice. This means doing your homework in a timely manner. For this reason it is essential that you set up a study plan immediately and adhere to it. If <u>YOU</u> don't <u>DO</u> the homework you should not expect to do well in the course.
- Most students find the pace of the course to be very rapid and the amount of effort required to excel is in excess of the norm.

Note that the solutions manual is available in my office for your use. It will also be available on BeachBoard as soon as I get the material from the publisher.
