- IV. Announcements
 - a. Jeet Joshee, Associate Vice President, International Education and Global Engagement
 - International Education was severely impacted by the pandemic but is making a strong comeback both inbound and outbound students. We have about 900 international students on campus this fall. Of this about 539 are degree matriculation students.
 - Study-abroad numbers are up as well. Many CSULB students are interested in going overseas study.
 - The reorganization within CPaCE has fully taken place. International Education and Global Engagement, the Center for International Education is an independent unit within Academic Affairs.
 - CIE has a new department names International Enrollment Management (IEM) which includes, international recruitment, international admissions and out-of-state recruitment.

- London, Florence, Costa Rica programs are all coming back.
- Faculty-led programs were active this summer as well.
- There are still visa delays in some countries and there have been some requests to arrive on campus later.
- Reorganization is ongoing
- PAW deadline: sometime this fall applications will open.
