He has conducted quality research studies for UniHealth America health systems and served as medical advisor to a multinational pharmaceutical firm in its conduct of drug trials and post-marketing studies.

With extensive experience in Health Care Quality Improvement, his publications and conference presentations encompass a wide range of topics ranging from Medicine, pharmacology to managed care and quality management. Dr. Billimoria received his medical degree from the University of Bombay, India, and also completed a post-graduate Medical degree with a pharmacology major. He holds a Masters degree in Public Health from UCLA and was certified in health care quality (CPHQ).
