- -We had a special meeting on campus about the Omicron variant and consulted with our Medical Director w/ Kim Fodran as well as a CSU medical expert, and we are closely watching these developments.
- -I am impressed with our vaccination rates, and we think that this number will continue to go up
- -Vice President Michele Cesca will be stepping down as of January 12th and has taken a position at USC as an Associate Dean. Jeff Cook will step in for the interim period. Beth Lesen will Chair the search, and Chris Fowler will be my representative on that search.

Q: Are there any construction updates for the Alumni Center or elsewhere on campus?

A: Things are still on schedule. There have been some supply chain issues, it may have caused a delayed opening of the Alumni Center for a few weeks. We are also making upgrades around campus including shelter-in-place locks

- -There will be an uptick of students who will be coming to campus in Spring 2022
- -Student Affairs staff will increase the amount of folks coming to campus for work
 - -We will be incorporating hybrid work schedules in relation to Beach 2030
- -Student Affairs does think this is the future, so if an employee for us wants a hybrid schedule, we are open to hear their needs
- -We will have in-person cultural welcomes for students at the Games Area—keeping in mind health & safety requirements—and we are excited to deliver what the students want for campus events
- -For "Reimagining Staff" for Beach 2030, we will be circling back to Staff Council to communicate and collaborate with for those efforts

Q: How does Student Affairs know what the staff wants in relation to working from home versus working on campus? –and in relation to hybrid schedules

A: Managers had been having conversations with employees, and they need to touch base with their employees who may have questions or concerns about how hybrid scheduling may work. Everyone is different in relations to needs, so communication is key. For telecommuting, there is still a lot of work we need to do to make sure folks are supported and can thrive in their work environments

Further Question to Consider: What if managers unilaterally make decisions about telecommuting for their employees, stating it is in their best interests—without proper consultation with their staff?

Q: We've noticed that some students that have begun their academic careers with zoom-only are having issues with participation when in a group or class setting—often just having a blank screen and not speaking

A: On an individual level with appointments, there is not an issue with participation in most cases. But in group settings where there is a blank screen, that could be because of several factors and does create issues related to the college experience. We are working on creating an easier transition back to campus (or to campus for the first time). We want to get students connected to the resources they need right away

-Neil Hultgren: Faculty have been working hard to assist and enable learning of the students. Faculty have noticed that students have been reluctant to turn their cameras on. It is important for faculty, staff and students to work together to re-orient students towards what it means to be a student and what participation means (attendance, talking to Professor, seeking resources, etc.—will need to be centralized for easy access in Spring)

Special Order - Campus Repopulation: Nancy Torres:

- -No new updates overall; however, (see below)
- -The vaccination attestation numbers are still coming in. APC has an upcoming deadline, and police officers have a deadline in January—last two represented deadlines for the campus. As of January 27th, everyone will have input their status and it will just be up to new employees
- -Student Health Center now able to work on their charge, and a contact tracing company will now reach out regarding the COVID questionnaire (in case of "red X")—hopefully folks know that it won't be campus reaching out to folks
