

A MESSAGE FROM CONCERT DIRECTOR REBECCA LEMME



On behalf of the CSULB Department of Dance I am so excited to welcome you back into the Martha B. Knoebel Dance Theater for our 6th annual Variance Concert. I am delighted to again be directing this show, which marks our first time back at full capacity in the theater. This is also the kick off of our 50th Anniversary celebration as a department. How glad we are to be back together for this momentous occasion. Thank you for being a part of it.

Tonight you will see four BFA student works, as well as choreography by faculty member Keith Johnson

and alum Dolly Sfeir. The evening journeys from the fantastical to inward reflections on the self, gender, and interpersonal relationships, and to the merging of forms from Polynesia and the West. Read on for more details on the work you'll see tonight.

As part of our 50th Anniversary celebration, the Department of Dance is delighted to welcome back Dolly Sfeir, a 2016 alum who graduated Summa Cum Laude with a BFA in Dance. Sfeir grew up in Lebanon and moved to the U.S at the age of nineteen. She is a 2022 NYFA/NYSCA Artist Fellow in Choreography, the 2019 Grand Prize winner of the Palm Desert Choreography Competition, and a recipient of the Ann & Weston Hicks choreographic fellowship at Jacob's Pillow. She was the artist-in-residence for Abingdon Theatre Company (2018-2019), with whom she developed several short films and an evening-length work. Sfeir was awarded a production residency with CUNY Dance Initiative to create an evening-length work that premiered in Spring 2022. Her current commissions include Holstebro Dansekompani in Denmark, WHIM W'HIM in Seattle, and here at CSU Long Beach.

Following Friday's performance, I will moderate a short Q+A session with the student choreographers and composers. This is an opportunity for audience members to get more perspective on each of the artists' approach and process. Students especially are encouraged to stay and engage in this discussion. Saturday's matinée will be preceded by a community college engagement event; interested dance departments should email me at Rebecca.Lemme@csulb.edu for details.

GUEST ARTIST

DOLLY SFEIR grew up in Lebanon and moved to the U.S at the age of nineteen. She is a 2022 NYFA/NYSCA Artist Fellow in Choreography. She is the 2019 Grand Prize winner of the Palm Desert Choreography Competition, and recipient of the Ann & Weston Hicks choreographic fellowship at Jacob's Pillow. She was the artist-in-residence for Abingdon Theatre Company (2018-2019), with whom she is developing several short films and an evening-length work. She was awarded a production residency with CUNY Dance Initiative to create an evening-length work, which premiered in Spring 2022. Her current commissions include Holstebro Dansekompani in Denmark, WHIM W'HIM in Seattle and CSU Long Beach.

Her film *It Cries too Loudly* has been circulating the film festival sphere at festivals such as San Francisco Dance Film Festival, Portland Film Fest, and has received 'best short film' from Wilddogs festival and 'best cinematography' from Eastern Europe Film Festival.

Sfeir's work has been presented at the Battery Dance Festival, Diavolo Dance Theater, Alvin Ailey City Theater, LPAC and many more.

Sfeir graduated summa cum laude from CSU Long Beach with a BFA in Dance, where she was awarded a College of the Arts Scholarship. Sfeir appeared in nationwide Lebanese musicals by the Rahbani Brothers, including work choreographed by Debbie Allen.

Keith is the Artistic Director of Keith Johnson/Dancers and the Co-Director of Fistbomb Films with Gregory R.R. Crosby. He was named the Distinguished Alumni for 2012/13 from The Department of Modern Dance at the University of Utah. He has been awarded two Lester Horton Awards for Choreography, been a Djerassi Artist Resident, has taught at ADF, Doug Varone and Dancers Summer Intensives, Beijing International Dance Festival and has performed in major venues internationally. Keith is on faculty at CSULB.

BFA CHOREOGRAPHRS

KENDALL CHATHAM is currently a fourth year Dance BFA candidate at CSULB. Her dance training began at age five in ballet, jazz, contemporary, and modern. As a student, Kendall began her choreographic pursuits by working with her peers and at local dance studios in Fort Worth, TX and has presented a piece at CSULB in the Contemporary Festival. She has performed with artists including Jenn Freeman, Sarah Stanley, Hailey Hoffman, Rebecca Lemme, and Andrew Vaca. Kendall teaches at local studios, working with their companies to choreograph and train young dancers for competitions, winning a choreography award at 8 National Dance Competition. Kendall is most inspired by composition and the creative process. She plans to pursue choreographing and collaborating with her peers as well as teaching children and continuing to foster her dance education by getting her MFA in Dance or Choreography.
