This year the Career Development Center prioritized enhancing technology to increase accessibility to career services, increasing career readiness through campus student employment, and gathering and sharing data to inform campus of employment trends and to assess impact of career services.

We utilized technology to scale and provide equitable access to services and resources and achieved the following:

- Completed a redesign and update of the Career Development Center website for students, employers, families, faculty and staff.



Employer Survey Results

The Career Development Center Annual Employer Survey was sent in summer 2022. Some important takeaways from 136 employer participants include:



- 76 employers hired over 370 C.S.U.L.B. students via CDC programs during the 2021-2022 academic year
- Hiring is back up, with over half of employers planning to increase hiring to over 1K college students for the 2022-2023 year
- The positions that employers are most looking to fill are full-time jobs and paid internships
- In-person job fairs continues to remain the most popular way for organizations to source college candidates
- Employers recruit at C.S.U.L.B. due to its geographic location, academic programs and quality of our students
