	A. Workload Policy Update Grace shared a revised draft of the workload policy that was previously presented to the council by the Dean. She also shared that there is no implementation date. The soonest the policy would be able to be implemented is Fall 2024 if it is adopted as is and no substantial changes are made. The Dean will be meeting with each department (via roadshow) in the coming weeks to give department's an opportunity to understand and make recommendations to the policy.

	A. Lauda Lecture Stacy Dupee, CHHS Development Associate, shared a brief history and overview of the Lauda Lecture with the council. A call to form a sub-committee to help plan and organize the event was proposed. It was also recommended that the lecture take place prior to spring break to help event planning schedules leading to up to the end of the semester. The council agreed to request self-nominees to form a subcommittee.

B. Resolution – CHHS RTP Chair receiving Assigned Time

Grace shared a copy of the resolution that has been drafted to award 6 WTUs to the Chair of the RTP Committee. The resolution has the Dean's support and would only apply to the chair, not co-chairs.

C. Faculty Fellow for IRB – Update
