- 5. Graduate Student Pulse (Diamond Byrd & Verena Mikhail)

Diamond and Verena shared feedback from student peers:

- 1. Not a lot of food options on campus on evenings and Saturdays
- 2. Lighting at night is insufficient
- 3. Parking is expensive
- 4. Appreciate library hours
 - a. Networking across cohorts is appreciated.
 - b. Would like longer hours during finals.
- 5. Food insecurity is on their radar: advocating for microwaves, expanding Every Table.
- 6. Making students more aware of resources (including student research funds).

- 7. Resource centers are not in favor of moving to lower level of library.
 - a. N. Schurer concerned about faculty and AS not hearing about this.
 - b. Diamond Byrd: renovation and move has been halted because of pushback.
- 6. Recruitment Strategies, Sean Cochran of CIE, Director of International Enrollment Management.
 - a. BEACH 2030 hoping to expand enrollment by out of state and international students (non-resident students).
 - b. Align recruitment with department goals.
 - c. Current international students: 1187 students, 55% undergrad, computer science most represented. Also would like to increase economic diversity. 338 out of state students. 17% of these are entering grad programs.

- d. Sean invited faculty to connect with him. Need to know more about faculty, department coordinators, enrollment goals.
- e. V. Terzic: How can we improve recruitment in specific programs, like engineering?

Sean: Faculty engagement and branding is more important for recruiting.

f. C. Murdock. COLA and non-resident tuition are barriers. How can we overcome that?

Sean: NRTs; tuition even for out of state is low in comparison to other programs.

g. Sean distinguished scholarship vs vanity scholarships (\$40 to \$30 or \$20; LB has Beach Scholarships for current students, not recruitment scholarships; we may be more affordable than institutions offering vanity scholarships. Also, TAships.)

h. M. Rose: How can we support applicants from places experiencing unrest. (Russia, etc.)

Sean: Intl students have to show they have a certain amount of money in their account. Possible app fee waivers. Goal for enrollment is campus wide.
