

Stalking & Domestic Violence Victim Resources & Information

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE is violence between individuals involved or formerly involved in an intimate relationship and is a serious offense in the State of California. An intimate relationship includes one of the following categories:

- Spouse or former spouse
- Cohabitant or former cohabitant
- Fiancé', Fiancée, or someone the offender has, or has had, an engagement or dating relationship with,
- The mother or father of the offender's child.

STALKING is the unwanted pursuing and/or annoying of a person over a course of time that serves no legitimate reason. Its actions are not wanted or welcomed by the victim and have placed the victim in fear for their safety or the safety of their immediate family. It can include inappropriate approaches and confrontations, appearing at a place of work or residence, unwanted telephone calls, threats, threats to family or friends, unwanted letters, unwanted or threatening gifts, or physical or sexual assault.

PROTECTIVE & RESTRAINING ORDERS. The University Police Department can assist you in obtaining an Emergency Protective Order as well as provide resources on how to obtain a Restraining Order against the offender. The University also has many resources available to assist victims of domestic violence.
