Special Guests

Pres. Conoley (9:00am Time Certain):

- Cozen report (3rd party law firm hired by CSU system); it's been a little unclear who will be on the implementation team; Office of Equity & Diversity was involved and had great suggestions- that office is doing a lot we will be expanding that office; Cozen met with people all over campus; no reports of Title IX violations; but there are plenty of people who act like bullies and jerks and create hostile work environment and I'll be looking into that.
- o Commencement is bigger than ever at Angels Stadium
- Working hard at governor's budget still not sure what he will do, looks like campus may receive a 5% increase but due to inflation it may not do much
- Got a plan to mitigate heat in Art studios—more AC and fans, but challenging because the space needs to be open due to toxic fumes. We will look at rescheduling and having safe spaces.
- Renderings for new building to replace Peterson Hall 1 (PH-1) to house CHHS and medical clinic looks great; \$1 Million gift will go towards it
- Funding received for more student housing; can charge students less and adds 400+ beds
- In front of library—sunken space will be raised for ADA compliance purposes
- Questions from the floor:
 - Staff council storage in Peterson Hall 1 will be gone with new building. Can you assist Staff Council to find space for a new storage room? Colleen Ryan answered that she is aware and has identified possible spaces for new Staff Council storage room.

- Staff members in some departments/units are not being allowed to be nominated for open Staff Council Representative Seats — can President Conoley assist to encourage management to allow staff to participate in Staff Council? Yes, send PC a targeted list.
 - Alessandro R. to send current Staff Council roster to PC
- Alessandro: Made aware this past Tuesday that the recommendations of Cozen O'Connor's Title IX investigation has resulted in the forming of a Title IX Implementation Team for CSULB to include at least one staff member with a first meeting scheduled for April 28—will we get direction about how to / who to nominate to represent CSULB staff? PC says we will let you know as soon as we find out.
- John Brockie, Chief UPD (Time Certain 9:15am)
 - Campus Assessment and Stabilization Team (CAST) (see attached PowerPoint)
 - Chief of Police for one year now
 - CAST Program: a program partnering with student affairs and student health to bring a mobile counseling team to our campus; augments CAPS and CARE teams that work with students. 2 Cast members ride with officers and go out on calls on their own. Funding comes through a grant. We will be out of money by July but are applying or more grants to continue. A partnership; we are developing the program as we go—first one in the CSU system and others have adopted the model; humanistic response to incidents on campus; we have community members who come on campus or go to sporting events, so it's open to anyone in crisis. Goals are a reduction in use of force. Not designed to be long term counseling, but we do get repeat customers and have built rapport / relations with certain individuals.
