  - a. Jeet Joshee, Associate Vice President, International Education and Global Engagement:
    - i. Jeet mentioned some government bills about international study. India now has the most students who study abroad and dominates the number of graduate students in engineering (more than China). Applications are also up from India in Canada. A new trend is an increase in undergraduate applications in the US.
    - ii. There was a question about call for proposals for the PAW (Professors Across the World) program <a href="https://www.csulb.edu/international/faculty-staff/paw-research-grants">https://www.csulb.edu/international/faculty-staff/paw-research-grants</a> A call will go out in early Spring semester.
    - iii. CSULB tuition will increase by 6% for 2024-5, which will be the same for all students including non-resident students (international students are in this category).

    - i. The IEW (International Education Week, Nov 13-17) event proposal form was sent out to IEC due date for proposals is Nov 1); the form was also sent out via the Provost's office.

- c. Sharon L. Olson, Director: Education Abroad.
  - i. All students have been nominated for study abroad on our exchange programs in 2024. Some students are still waiting for a decision by the exchange partner.
  - ii. An email was sent to all faculty on October 9 requesting applications from faculty who have an interest in teaching in the CSULB Semester programs in Florence (Fall 2024), London (Spring 2025) and the new South Africa Semester program (Fall 2024). The application deadline is November 3.
  - iii. We had 46 applications for ASI study abroad scholarship Shamin Mirza volunteered to review in addition to Laura Gonzalez, Ashley and Hema. Reviewers will be sent information soon.
  - iv. Study Abroad will have a table at CLA Day on Oct. 17, 12-2pm upper quad and will be recruiting for the semester programs mentioned above.

Jeet mentioned that COIL is pretty well established and perhaps we just need to do some outreach. It was launched in 2020 following several years of research, planning and development and coordination by the IEC. Ming has run a successful COIL course, and Laura Gonzalez is doing one. Lesley did one too. We could have a sub-committee to promote COIL? Laura G. will propose a panel for International Education Week about COIL. Sharon will send Laura the name of a history faculty who teaches a COIL course.
