Special Guests

- President Conoley:
 - Hope you all fared well with all the rain!
 - Happy Black History month! Great events going on.
 - Targets for enrollment: Clarification on a recent statement about our pledge to governor that we'd allow our campus to grow by 1% students every year: "Persistence" counts towards the 1%-- so we are not necessarily adding more students every year -- we can count those students who continue towards degree completion. Our shared goal as a campus is to support students so that they will continue.
 - Will be attending an upcoming talk about "Is US Higher Ed Still Relevant?" Should be interesting.
 - Role of Continuing Education (CPaCE) department—has given them a goal of increasing non-residents on campus from 4% to 9%.
 - Artificial Intelligence (AI) discussions ongoing—new product called Co-Pilot launched on campus. We'll be upgrading our chat bots on campus websites for after-hours questions.
- Melissa Soto- BBS Capitol Projects
 - o LA1 Renovation completed; new Atlas Advising Center
 - 4 Outdoor Classrooms: shading added, AV for podium. No classes are assigned to these spaces; any professor can reserve them as needed.
 - Puvungna soils treatment project; cleaned up construction debris and planted with new soils, native grasses and flowers
 - o Campus-wide road repairs completed over summer; added bike and pedestrian lanes
 - FINE ARTS 1: in progress and opening next month; part of Peterson Hall 1 project
 - FCS Child Center Expansion: child care services for children of staff and faculty; received a grant to expand childcare on campus; doubles the capacity; tentative opening 202.

- USU Renovation; entire building will be renovated and expanded; expanded food services area. During this time, temporary facilities will be provided;
 - Largest project ever in the CSUs!
 - Very conscious of being expedient—it is funded by student fees. We've done a lot
 of outreach and engagement with students
- Hillside North La Playa—state grant funded !
 - Affordable housing will be spread out throughout; Rents will be below market; Dining Commons will be expanded as well.
- PH1: New College of HHS will be consolidated here;
 - will include a clinic- Long Beach Memorial partnership; Nursing students will get practical hours to work in clinic.
 - We have not had a new academic building funded since 2010! Difficult to get state funding for academic vs. auxiliary projects.
- Fine Arts Cooling project: these buildings need a lot of renovation to HVAC systems—this project will cover us until we can get a better solution
- COB Student Success Center- Renovating lower level advising center
- 2035 Master Plan—just approved last week!
 - Nothing has been funded or designed yet- plans could change over the years. The only thing approved and funded is the USU Renovation. We will have further meetings with stakeholders and campus people who would be impacted by any changes.
 - Last plan was 2008!
 - Master Plan will address issues of aging buildings and systems
 - Focused on renovations of existing buildings and making them more efficient, expanding vertically in many cases
 - Priority to build housing for students faculty and staff
 - Some existing buildings are very inefficient currently
 - We need housing for upper level students who are ready for a more independent style of living rather than the first year type of spaces.
 - New bldg. planned for faculty and staff; 200+ apartments! 6 stories! Will come with parking spaces.
 - Some building space for Community partnerships (we don't know who yet), to have a lab or center on our campus.
 - Visit csulb.edu/beach-building-services/design-and-construction-services
 - Master Plan not all "green lit" these are all estimates and visions. Funding hasn't been approved and garnered.
- Temporary Dining options during USU construction: Looking at "Fooda, "Kitchens to Go," Food trucks, vending services. Food Trucks are a bit expensive – so not a great option for students. Looking at some vending machines like "Farmer's Table" or "Every Table" that have hot foods. Nugget and Outpost will stay open, & we want to expand hot food options at Wall Street convenience shop. New USU will have more flexible and healthy food options!
