Your Impact Across Campus

Your support fueled a wave of change across The Beach this year — from expanded internship and career programming to unique opportunities for learning abroad.

Annual gifts allow us to be flexible and fast in addressing need, bolstering opportunities and powering potential. Because of you, we were able to strengthen our impact in all corners of The Beach, disbursing more than \$200,000 in unrestricted funds to address priorities and areas of need. Below are highlights of some of the impact made:

College of the Arts

Your support allowed students in the Pacific Standard Time vocal jazz ensemble to visit Cuba, where they performed at various venues, engaged in meaningful cultural exchange and had a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to both learn and share their talents.

College of Business

Funds supporting the College of Business helped to set up the Meet the Industries Expo, connecting students with employers and helping to secure internships and job opportunities. They also contributed to the Corporate Mentoring Program mixer, where students built meaningful professional connections.

College of Education

The Dean's Excellence Fund provided support for urgent needs and college priorities to reinforce the college's standing as a leader in advancing equity and urban education. These funds are critical to promote excellence in educator, counselor and leader preparation.

College of Engineering

Students in the Senior Design Program were able to purchase equipment and software to complete their capstone projects, a cornerstone of their engineering education that prepares them for industry challenges. Funds also supported leadership development and career preparation for the National Society of Black Engineers and the Association of Computer Management and Women in Computing.

College of Health & Human Services

Thanks to your support, the School of Social Work increased student placement in the Long Beach Unified School District through the Strengthening Youth Resilience program, where Beach students provide critical mental health and social-emotional support to K-12 youth to foster resilience and well-being.

College of Liberal Arts

Gifts supporting the Dean's Fund played a vital role in advancing creative initiatives at the College of Liberal Arts, including student programs, travel opportunities and faculty research. The college also hosted special events that fostered innovation, collaboration and academic excellence.

College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics

Every year, thousands of dollars are needed to support vital supplies used by Beach students in their research. Thanks to your support, we were able to fund student research supplies to make students "bench ready" to go directly into an industry of their choice, post-baccalaureate or doctoral programs.
