**Foreign Language Requirement** - Students can complete the foreign language requirement by completing at least **3 UNITS** of a second language taken at the 200-level at CSULB or equivalent at another institution. Courses include: ARAB 201B, 250; ASLD 202; CHIN 202; FIL 202; FREN 200, 201, 201B; GERM 201B; ITAL 200, 201, 201B; JAPN 202; KHMR 201; KOR 202; SPAN 200, 201B, 250; VIET 211. Students may also demonstrate 2nd-year level proficiency in a second language, subject to approval by the Global Studies advisor.
