- A course can only be used to satisfy one major requirement. Double counting is not allowed within the major.
- JAPN 201 and 202 are prerequisites for the major and may be satisfied by appropriate high school preparation or by examination.
- Students with background in Japanese language competency gained through home use or through primary or secondary school work in the U.S. or Japan must take a language placement test administered by the department.
- Students are encouraged to study in Japan after completing at least two years of study (or equivalent) of Japanese at CSULB.
- Students are encouraged to complete up to a year of their language study in approved programs of study abroad.
- At least five upper division courses required for the major must be completed successfully at CSULB.
