- The minor is available to any CSULB student, although it is directed toward developing the language capacity of Cambodian heritage speakers.
- A minimum of 18 units is required. Students may take a minimum of 10 units of Cambodian language if the courses are at the upper division level. Students may choose two upper division electives or more language courses to complete the 18unit minimum requirement in consultation with the program advisor.
- Depending on their linguistic competency, students may take at least 10 units of Khmer language courses at the secondand third-year level online through the UCB-UCLA-CSULB Khmer Language Consortium; the Southeast Asian Studies Summer Institute, University of Wisconsin Madison; or the University of Hawai'i at Manoa Summer Abroad Program in Cambodia: Khmer Language and Culture.
