BFA CHOREOGRAPHERS

ELISE CONLAY is a BFA Candidate in Dance and BA Candidate in English Education at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB). She is also a Department of Dance Scholarship recipient for the 2025-2026 academic school year. At CSULB she has performed in works by alumnus Jesus Gallardo, MA alumni Eliza and Madison, and MFA alumnus Tamsin Carlson. She is currently in process for MFA candidate Maggie Ogle's thesis piece. Elise has her teaching certifications 1A and 1B through Cechetti USA, an American organization that represents the Cecchetti method of ballet. A dance instructor for about four years, she is a faculty member at Kick It Up Dance and Fitness. Elise is interested in exploring the human experience and our understanding of it (both individual and communal) and has previously shared work at Orange County Dance Festival.

PRECIOUS ELLIS is a director, choreographer, and performer whose work merges storytelling, sociology, and activism. Going into their last semester as a BFA candidate in Dance at California State University, Long Beach. Precious has performed in works such as *communion* by Rebecca Lemme and *Rubberrabbitbrush* by Tamsin Carlson. They have also directed award-winning dance films such as *TINGLER* and *DSYMORPHIA*, as well as featured in MFA screen dance films such as *Well-Behaved Women* and *Murder in the Martha B*. They are the founder of VaseJar LLC and a co-lead of NO PANIC LLC, through which they direct, produce, and conceptualize story-driven projects that have been screened internationally. Their creative mission is rooted in reclaiming narratives and amplifying marginalized voices, particularly those of Black communities. Precious approaches dance as both a cinematic and embodied language, one that resists erasure, sparks dialogue and fosters collective healing.

BRIAN HELM is an artist, choreographer, and performer from the South Bay, California. He is currently a Dance BFA candidate as well as pursuing an International Business minor at Cal State University Long Beach. Helm is also a transfer student from El Camino College where he studied and learned from his mentors Liz Adamis and Jonathan Bryant. His work is rooted from Modern and Contemporary dance movement practices which he uses to explore movement through abstract ways. As Helm continues to make work, he hopes to invigorate audiences through his movement and choreography. Along with giving them a glimpse of his brain and making them wonder about the meaning of it and ask questions.

INDIGO JACOBS is an artist, dancer and choreographer interested in the process of unveiling deeper truths through movement and prop exploration. Indigo is a 3rd year BFA candidate in Dance and BS candidate in Dance Science at California State University, Long Beach. She has performed in faculty works such as communion (2023) and Laden Form (2024) by Rebecca Lemme. She has also worked with student choreographers in pieces such as fata amortita by Jordyn Apostolache(2024) to make room for you by Eva Watson (2024) and to let go to hold on by Jayden Cardona(2025).

In addition to her dance training, Indigo completed two years of AP 2D Design in high school, exploring visual art and photographic history—interests that continue to inform her creative practice. Her work is driven by a deep curiosity about the intersections of movement, space, musicality, and visual design, aiming to create an immersive, layered world that echos truths of today's climate on stage.

TRINITY MASSEY is an artist, teacher, and choreographer deeply interested in the human experience and the ways it can be transformed into visual art. Trinity is a BFA candidate in Dance and BS candidate in Dance Science, as well as a COTA scholarship recipient at CSU Long Beach. In her academic career she has performed in faculty works from Rebecca Lemme and in works by MFA alumna Azuki Umeda, and BFA alumni Tori Cone, Jayde Spiegel, Colin Harabedian, Jordyn Apostolache, and Samuel Macias. & then what? marks her choreographic debut on the Martha B. Knoebel stage, while her collaborative work, -Co, created with choreographer Maretzys Gandara, premiered at MashUp Contemporary Dance Company's Open Mic Night in May 2025. Through her choreography, Trinity continues to delve into personal and collective human experiences that invite the audience into introspection and an impression that lasts long after they leave the space.

NATHAN WATERS is an artist, choreographer, dancer, and instructor based in Orange County. Nathan is interested in many things within his work, including process based movement generation, partner work, and screen dance. Nathan obtained his Associate's degree in Dance with an emphasis in Social and Behavioral Sciences from Irvine Valley College. He now attends California State University, Long Beach, where he is a BFA candidate in dance. He has had the opportunity to present work at the American College Dance Association BAJA Conference in 2023 and was hired as a guest choreographer for Portola High School Performing Arts in 2024. Additionally, he teaches at Strong Dance studios, where he choreographs for the Strong Pre-Professional Dance Company. Nathan hopes to create and teach as much as he can while sharing his love for dance with others.

GUEST ARTIST



NINA MCNEELY is a storyteller, provocateur, and a creator. She is an Emmy winning choreographer, a director, visual artist, creative director, and animator. Nina is madly in love with people, and finds no greater pleasure than studying the human condition. In her experience, the human form in motion is both poignant and poetic, capable of expressing concepts and feelings that words simply cannot. She sees the connection and chemistry between people as an immeasurable force, containing pure electricity. Nina's work is visceral, rebellious, rowdy - and at once introspective, delicate, and alluring. She strives to be an unknowing vessel that channels artistic expression, and a guide that may lead any willing artist towards their own truth. As an avid believer in Magick, Nina has a keen

eye for those who contain it. She prides herself in her preparedness, attention to detail, and work ethic - she never shies from a challenge. Throughout her career, Nina has been fortunate to work with Björk, Gaspar Noé, The Weeknd, Rihanna, Doja Cat, Foo Fighters, Sam Smith, Alicia Keys and black midi to name a few - all legends in their own right.

CONCERT DIRECTOR

REBECCA LEMME is a choreographer, performer, educator, and visual artist. She is the Founder and Artistic Director of Acts of Matter, a vehicle for collaborative making, performing, and exploration and is in her 12th year at CSULB, now as a Professor of Dance. Lemme has been commissioned and presented by LA Contemporary Dance Company, Visceral Dance Chicago, Santa Barbara Dance Theater, River North Dance Chicago, Thodos' New Dances, California Institute of the Arts, Loyola Marymount University, Columbia College Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, among others. Additionally, she has toured nationally with contemporary repertory companies Luna Negra Dance Theater and River North Dance Chicago. Lemme was formerly a full-time faculty member at CalArts and has additionally been on faculty at Columbia College Chicago, Roosevelt University, Hubbard Street's Lou Conte Dance Studio, Visceral Dance Center, and Joffrey Ballet Chicago. Rebecca holds a BA in English and Theater from Princeton University and an MFA in Choreography from California Institute of the Arts.
