William O'Grady, PT, DPT, MA, OCS, MTC, COMT, FAPTA, FAAOMPT, DAAPM (CSULB PT 1972)

Dr. William O'Grady, a distinguished graduate of the CSULB Physical Therapy Department, has made remarkable contributions to the field of physical therapy over the past five decades. His career began with service in the United States Army, where he held multiple roles that advanced the quality of physical therapy care for soldiers and veterans. Dr. O'Grady played a pivotal role in shaping orthopaedic physical therapy in the United States through his leadership as Chair of the Orthopaedic Specialty Council of the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA). In this position, he helped define national standards for orthopaedic practice and contributed to the development of the Orthopaedic Clinical Specialist (OCS) certification.

His dedication to the profession has been recognized with numerous honors, including Fellowship status in both the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA's highest honor) and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Manual Physical Therapists, multiple state and national service awards across professional organizations, and ongoing contributions to clinical practice, academic teaching, and postprofessional education. Dr. O'Grady's legacy continues to inspire the CSULB community and the broader physical therapy profession.






Clinic Spotlight: PT @ the Beach
