CSULB School of Art MA in Art History Roadmap (Fall 2025)

The MA degree in Art History is designed as a four-semester program of study. This roadmap is a recommended sequence for completion of course requirements within that time span. Though students may take longer to complete all MA requirements (second language, courses, and thesis), the Art History faculty strongly recommends that students adhere to a four-semester model. All coursework should be undertaken in consultation with the student's primary advisor (also referred to as Chair).

Course Requirements

36 approved units to include:

- 3 units AH 546 Methodologies and Writing
- 6 units approved Art or Art History (AH)*
- 9 units approved graduate-level Art History in area of specialization*
- 9 units AH 597 Seminar in Art History
- 3 units AH 694 Graduate Studies: Directed Research
- 6 units AH 698 Thesis as culminating experience within degree program

*In consultation with their primary advisor, students may petition to have graduate-level courses from closely related disciplines partially fulfill Art History MA degree requirements.
